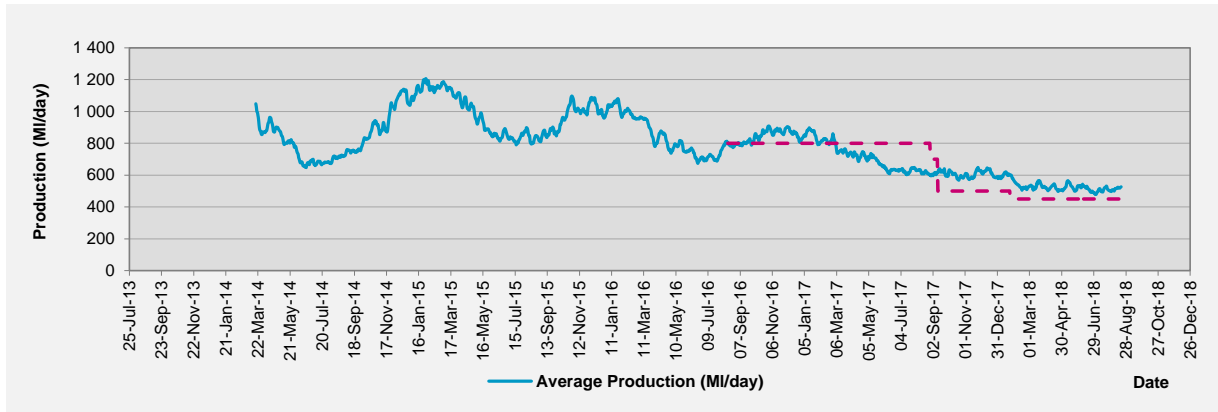
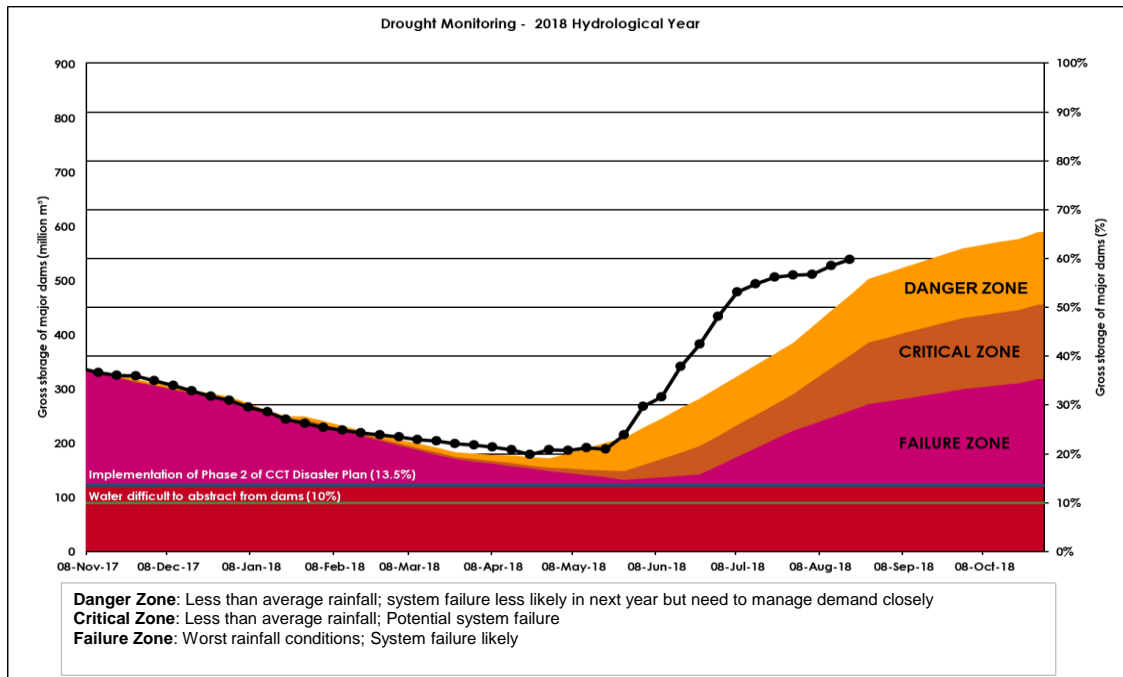


Water Usage from large dams comprising the Western Cape Water Supply System

This graph depicts total dam storage against potential system risk scenarios. The previous graph monitored the dam level draw down against the 2017 rainfall conditions under different restriction levels.



Water stored in major dams comprising Western Cape Water Supply System (WCWSS)

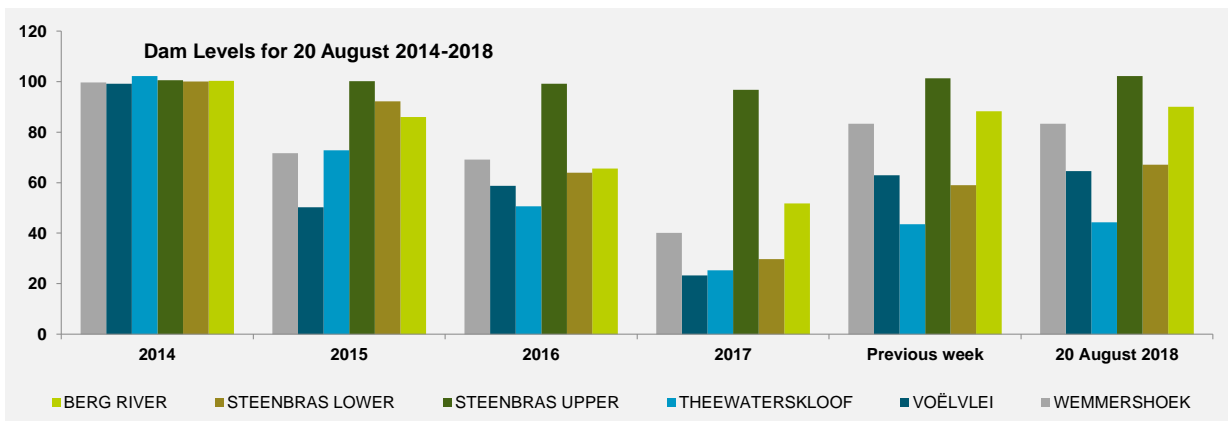

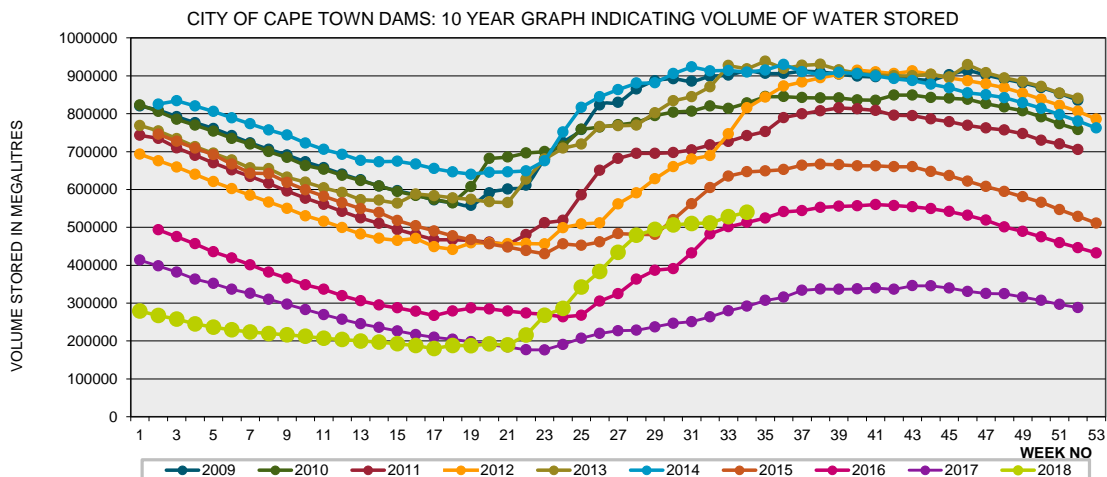
1) Capacity of the major dams of the Western Cape Water Supply System is 99.6% and that of the minor dams 0.4% of the combined capacity of the major and minor dams. Kindly note that all the Major Dams show gross capacity.

2) All figures are for 20 August for each year except for those in the second column, which gives the figures for the previous week of this year.

3) The last 10% of a dam's water is difficult to use, the useable water in the dam is approximately 10% less than the dam level.



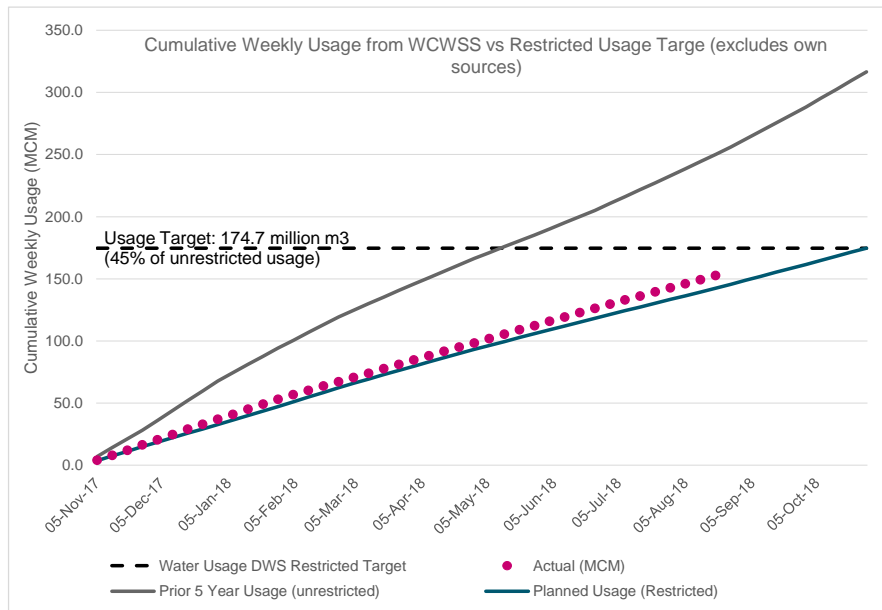
Ten year graph Indicating volume of water stored in major dams comprising Western Cape Water Supply System (WCWSS)

Compliance, measured against all prescribed chemical and microbiological components, consistently exceeds the very high CCT target of 98%. (Overall compliance percentages of continuous sampling and analysis are released on a monthly basis. The latest available is for June).
