






3) The last 10% of a dam's water is difficult to use, the useable water in the dam is approximately 10% less than the dam level.

# Water usage from large dams comprising the Western Cape Water Supply System



The above graph tracks City of Cape Town (CCT) water usage against the Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS) restriction requirement against our unrestricted demand (or past usage). Restriction targets have changed asof 1 December 2018. CCT has been restricted at 30% against the WCWSS approved allocation to the CCT.

This table shows CCT drinking water quality compliance according to the South African National Standard 241:2015. Compliance, measured against all prescribed chemical and microbiological components, consistently exceeds the very high CCT target of 98%. (Overall compliance percentages of continuous sampling and analysis are released on a monthly basis. The latest available is for December).
